Our **Story**

FOUNDATION

Bravery Trust was created by Defence for Defence.

In 2012, a group of visionary leaders recognised there was a gap in the provision of specialised assistance for contemporary veterans, particularly those involved in deployments fighting for Australia's freedom across the Middle East.

40 Australians were killed, more than 250 were seriously injured, and many more returned with lifelong mental scars, the wider impact of which was being felt by veterans' family members.

Bravery Trust was established with funding from the Federal Government Department of Defence so that serving, ex-serving and family members of those injured could access financial support. The Trust was officially launched by the former Minister for Defence the Hon Stephen Smith 23 April 2012.

Over the past decade, the work of the Trust has evolved from a welfare-first model to one of empowerment based on education. But our core purpose, to support those who serve, and our key values of respect, compassion, collaboration and innovation remains true to the Bravery Trust mission.

To strengthen our impact, we actively seek to partner with the private sector and other Ex Service Organisations. Our service is underpinned by a deep understanding of the values, ethos and challenges of service life in the modern military.



Jason's Story

After serving more than 10 years in the Australian Army, Jason Jinks deployed to Iraq in 2004 as part of the security detachment for the Australian Embassy. For 10 years he blocked the death of a young boy from his mind. "And then it sort of crept its way into the forefront of my consciousness and that's when, with the encouragement of my wife, I started counselling," he said.

"He'd been selling soft drink bottles on the corner opposite our building every day. They tried to blow us up at certain times and when there was a car bomb, a VBIED incident, and the young child was killed, the locals actually put a lot of blame on us. Even though we had nothing to do with it, they blamed us because we were there.

"I would encourage anyone that does have any issues that they think are going to affect their lives to seek out the support that is available ... I'm in a brilliant spot now,."

Mr Jinks sought financial help from the Bravery Trust "I was going through a bit of a difficult patch, I was sort of in a dark space and we had a couple of big bills & other financial things pop up and a friend recommended Bravery Trust.

"It's always hard to put your hand up and say "I need help" and I really didn't want to do it, but their empathy was so real."



Financial Counselling

HOW WE HELP

Bravery Trust provides a free, independent, confidential, veteran specific Financial Counselling Service. Our service is founded on an in-depth understanding of the ADF and veteran support systems.

Our financial counsellors have specific knowledge about credit, responsible lending, bankruptcy and debt collection laws, concession frameworks, industry hardship practices and Buy Now Pay Later debts. They are also trained in negotiation and counselling.

Financial Education

HOW WE HELP

Bravery Trust's Financial Fitness program helps veterans and their families to be financially fit and avoid hardship through education about money and financial products. We can work with individuals or present to groups and tailor our work to meet the specific needs of the group or family we are working with.

Financial mentoring

Individualised one-on-one mentoring to help veterans & their families develop money management skills, understand spending leaks and implement new financial habits. We can help track spending, find ways to reduce costs and, importantly, link veterans with other services which will help them achieve their goals.

Preventative

Working proactively to encourage earlier conversations about finances amongst veterans and their families. We work collaboratively with other agencies and present to large and small groups to initiate conversations about finances and help veterans improve their financial fitness at all stages of life.

Let's talk about the "F" word

Removing the stigma around financial conversations. We call it our "F" word. We use the "F" word every day, working to normalise conversations about financial challenges so veterans feel empowered to reach out early when circumstances change, or when things go off track.

Earlier conversations can reduce the stress and impact of hardship.

Mark & Ellen

Army Veteran Mark and his wife Ellen were feeling increasingly stressed by mounting bills and financial obligations after an unexpected change to their household income earlier this year.

"Asking for help was really difficult for us, we didn't feel comfortable asking for money. But we were starting to feel quite depressed by the situation and knew we needed to take action," Mark said.

"We know veterans are at a higher risk of suicide so being able to access this type of help is very important ... Finances can make life tough. The support of Bravery Trust really does save lives!"

Mark and Ellen have 5 children - the youngest just graduated high school. Bravery Trust provides financial assistance for veterans who have sustained injury or illness as a result of service and are facing hardship. In this case, we were able to assist the family with last of the school fees and some urgent household bills, providing much-needed relief to allow time for the family to rest and adjust to their change in finances.

In addition to helping us provide Financial Aid, Financial Education and Financial Counselling services to the veteran community, Wilson Security initiated a Veteran Employment Program in 2022, recognising the unique skillset and values veterans can bring to civilian employment. The program was recently expanded to cater for ADF Spouse and Families. The pilot program has placed 27 veterans and 28 family members into permanent employment and reflects Wilsons ongoing commitment to the veteran community.

Bravery Trek

GET INVOLVED

Bravery Trek celebrates the service of Australian veterans, specifically those who serve & have served during contemporary wars – and raises vital funds to provide financial support to veterans who have been injured or sustained illness during service. 70% of veterans who receive support from Bravery Trust are aged 50 years or younger.

Bravery Trek is held during Veterans' Health Week (October) each year. It is a virtual distance challenge meaning anyone can join anywhere. Run, swim, cycle, paddle, wheelchair or push a pram – all participants help engage veterans who may need support and those who can refer a friend.



\$103,858 Raised - 228 Participants

Bravery Trek 2023 challenged participants to run, walk, ride, roll or swim 4 marathons (168.8km) in 44 days to raise funds & initiate conversations about what it means to serve and the challenges faced by some members when they transition from the ADF into civilian life.

While most logged kilometres in stages, Murray Bruce and Singh Talwar ran 4 full marathons in Canberra, Sydney, Brisbane and Melbourne. Murray also topped the fundraising leaderboard for a third year in a row.











Anzac Day Eve Charity Partner

Richmond Football Club joined with Melbourne FC to establish an Anzac Day Eve AFL match in 2016, to create an occasion that focused on contemporary veterans and encouraged the crowd to reflect on those who have recently served or are currently serving. The game is played at the Melbourne Cricket Ground and has grown significantly, attracting crowds around 80,000 and a TV audience of 1 million.

In 2023 Bravery Trust Ambassador Flight Lieutenant Adon Lumley delivered a keynote speech to the Melbourne Football Club at their President's Function as part of Anzac Day commemorations and also spoke about the values, ethos and challenges of service life when addressing the players at the Shrine of Remembrance.
